RELEASED: SUMMER 2014

The Reason-Rupe 2014 Millennial Poll interviewed 2000 millennial adults ages 18–29 between February 28th–March 11th, 2014 from all 50 states and the District of Columbia using YouGov's web-enabled survey technology and proprietary sampling and matching methodology. The margin of sampling error is +/- 3.4%.

Statistical results are weighted to correct known demographic discrepancies. When feasible, answer choices within questions were rotated or randomized.






9. Combining Question 7 and 8 responses, with their perceptions of specific politicians...


Note: Different colors represent clusters of ideological groups, derived from hierarchical cluster analysis. Median responses plotted.




How Millennials Perceive Obama's Social Issue Positions Compared to Their Own Social Issue Positions

How Millennials Perceive Obama's Economic Issue Positions Compared to Their Own Economic Issue Positions






How Millennials Perceive Congressional GOP's Economic Issue Positions Compared to Their Own Economic Issue Positions




